

Censorship. The very word can make a writer's blood run cold. One's work can be labeled heretical, seditious, or obscene by others. Mark Twain, John Steinbeck, Harper Lee, and J.K.Rowling have all had their works banned by different groups. A reader's freedom of choice to read challenging ideas or concepts is limited by any attempt to censor materials at the public library.


